## Retro Bus Model Course

Tour Lake Kawaguchiko, Lake Saiko, and the general area on a bus pass that allows two days unlimited use of the Lake Kawaguchiko and Lake Saiko-Aokigahara sightseeing lines.

**a Kawaguchiko Museum of Art**  
 Take the Kawaguchiko retro bus sightseeing line. Get off at the stop for the "Kawaguchiko Bijutsukan" (Kawaguchiko Museum of Art). The museum itself is surrounded by the magnificent Mount Fuji and the sparkling lake. Around the area are long-term exhibits of past as well as modern-day artistic depictions of Mount Fuji, including paintings, woodblock prints, and photographs.

**b Itchiku Kubota Art Museum**  
 Color-dye artist Itchiku Kubota created patterns from the Muromachi Period. Today the exquisite "Tsujigahana" technique in which he specialized is seeing a revival in the form of "Itchiku Tsujigahana". It is now possible to gain a greater appreciation of the world of Itchiku, previously hidden away in objects of art, gardens, and structures.

**c Open-Air Bath "Tensui"**  
 Take the Kawaguchiko retro bus, then get off at the stop for the "Itchiku Kubota Art Museum". Located on the skirt of Mount Fuji at an elevation of 900 meters, this natural hot spring wells up from 1,500 meters underground on the north shore of Lake Kawaguchiko. Many visitors like to soak in the outdoor bath while immersing themselves in the forest. Cascade-stream and bubble-bath areas also have been set up.

**d Nagasaki Park**  
 Take the Kawaguchiko retro bus, then get off at the stop for the "Sunside (Resort) Mae Nagasaki" park entrance. Lakeside visitors can gaze at Mt. Fuji and a vast sky. Mid-April is typically the time for enjoying the cherry blossoms. Various other flowers come into bloom with the season.

**e Oishi Pongee Traditional Craft Center**  
 Take the Kawaguchiko retro bus, then get off at the stop for "Shizen Seikatsu-kan" (Kawaguchiko Natural Living Center). Articles made with Oishi silk are on sale. The center also hosts experiential classes on herbal dyeing, making small items with cocoons, and other crafts.

**f Kawaguchiko Shizen Seikatsu-kan Kawaguchiko Natural Living Center**  
 Take the Kawaguchiko retro bus, then get off at the stop for the Kawaguchiko Shizen Seikatsu-kan ("Kawaguchiko Natural Living Center"). The center is in Oishi Park, which faces a Kawaguchiko lakeside of beautiful lavender in summer. Amid the rows of shops and cafes, visitors may join jam-making workshops or, in summer and fall, participate in fruit-picking activities.

## Walking Model Course

Six site tour starting at Kawaguchiko Station

- 1 Tenjoyama Park Mt. Kachi Kachi Ropeway**  
 The only ropeway in the Fuji Five Lakes district straddles Mount Tenjo, located east of Lake Kawaguchiko. The ropeway provides a spectacular view of Mount Fuji from the summit to the base as well as a wide, panoramic view of Lake Kawaguchiko. Hours of operation: 9 a.m. to 5:10 p.m. (closes 5:20 p.m. from April 29 to Oct. 15). Open all year (except during bad weather and ropeway maintenance checks). - 2 Ubuyagasaki**  
 Photographers love this cape, especially in the spring. For its ideal location for taking pictures of Mt. Fuji surrounded by the lake and cherry blossoms.
- 3 Kawaguchiko Ohashi Bridge**  
 This north-south arched bridge links the Ubuyagasaki peninsula, in the eastern part of Lake Kawaguchiko, to Nashimiya Park on the southern shore. A walkway along the bridge affords great views of the lake and Mount Fuji. But be careful about stepping onto the roadway, as motor traffic on the bridge can be heavy!
- 4 Kawaguchiko Herb Hall**  
 Visitors will find an array of herbal goods and souvenirs on sale. Or you might want to create your own aromas or make a wreath in the experiential studio. The perfume house annex deals in all manner of fragrant articles. There is also a coffee shop. Business hours: 9 a.m. to 6 p.m. (closes 5:30 p.m. from November to March). - 5 Oike Park**  
 Facilities for tourists surround the park, which is full of poplar trees. Rent a boat to take out on Lake Kawaguchiko, or hike the lakeside nature course. The changing colors in fall are an amazing sight. In winter, the park becomes the main venue for large-scale events such as the "kojo no mai" (lake fireworks show).
- 6 Yamanashi Gem Museum**  
 Yamanashi leads all other Japanese prefectures in the shipment value of jewelry. The shop in this comprehensive museum stocks a wide assortment of items from miniature crystals and cellphone straps popular as souvenirs to genuine accessories. Hours of operation: March through October, 9 a.m. to 5:30 p.m.; November through February, 9:30 a.m. to 5 p.m. (last admission 30 minutes before closing). Closed on Wednesdays (open on national holidays) and at year-end. Note: We remain open during the Golden Week holidays, throughout July and August, and during the new-year holidays. **a Unoshima Island**  
In the only island (about 700m in circumference) in Lake Kawaguchi, clayware and stoneware from the Jomon and Yayoi periods have been discovered. During the civil war era, it was used as a place of shelter for residents escaping the war; it was also a penal colony for prisoners. In the 16th century, the Unoshima Shrine was built. The Water God Toyama-hime no Mikoto (Princess Toyama), who is also thought to be an incarnation of a catfish is worshipped at the shrine. Every year, on April 25th, an annual festival to keep water disasters away and prayer for rain is held. After the Shinto ritual, local elementary school and junior high school students who are gorgeously dressed perform Chigonoma (Dance of child of festival). Only on this day, a free ferry ride can be used to get to the opposite shore, and tourists can offer prayers to the shrine.

**b Rusugaiwa Rock**  
At the end of a bend at Kazaki, there is a rock that is part of a legend of lost love. A long time ago, a young man named Kouemon, who was from Koumi (Katsuyama), fell in love with a young woman named Orusu. She was from Oishi. Kouemon lived on the opposite side of the shore. Every night, Kouemon would cross the lake in a tarai-bune boat (A wash-tub shaped boat); and Orusu would light a fire on the rock so that Kouemon could find her, and they would meet secretly. One stormy evening, Kouemon and his boat were swallowed by a big wave. Not knowing what had happened, Orusu kept waiting for Kouemon, but he didn't show up. Thinking that Kouemon no longer loved her, she threw herself from off the rock. From then on, villagers who tell story for Orusu named the rock "Rusugaiwa (Orusu's Rock)".

**c Kifune Shrine**  
According to "Kalkobashi" a history book from Yamanashi Prefecture, in the 2nd year of the Joo era (1223), the shrine was established from a division of the Kifune Shrine in Kyoto City. The mountain dragon god and the valley dragon god are revered in this shrine. Both gods are the rain god. As well as providing a good harvest and helping families to flourish, it was also a maritime God that protected ships and blessed sea operations. For this reason, it is said that many who were drafted to join the war effort and many, including family members from outside Yamanashi prefecture, who had their family members sent to the war came here to offer prayers. It is a tangible cultural property of the town. The current front shrine was rebuilt in the 25th year of the Heisei era (2013).

**d Katsuyama Horseback Archery Festival**  
The Katsuyama Horseback Archery Festival is a Shinto ritual which is performed by the Fuji Omuro Sengen Shrine to signal the coming of spring to the Katsuyama district. The festival boasts over a 900 year long history. It is held at the Shikigoko Koen (Shikigoko Park) adjacent to the shrine. The festival began when Kai-Genji clan's founder, Shinrasaburo Yoshimitsu, made an offering to the shrine to celebrate the "Gosannen War" (1083 - 87) victory. A member of The Japan Equestrian Archery Association who's been taught the "Takeda style horseback archery" would wear a traditional costume called "Yorihitotare", and while sitting on a horse running at full speed, they would accurately shoot through the target. The spectacle of Katsuyama Horseback Archery Festival makes this a civil era scene on an old picture scroll, and it leaves a big impact on the mind.

**h Kawaguchi Asama Shrine**  
In the year 864 (Jogan era 6th year), to quell the eruption of Mt. Fuji, the shrine was founded the year following an eruption. The enshrined deity is Konohana Sakuyahime no Mikoto (Princess Konohana Sakuya). Kawaguchi Sengen Shrine is one of the Mt. Fuji World Cultural Heritage assets. Chigonoma (Dance performed by children in the festival) is performed at the annual festival held on April 25th, and at the Odada Matsuri (Odada Festival) held on July 28th. In the shrine precinct, there is a sacred tree called "Nanahon Sugi (Seven Cedars)"; it is over 1,200 years old. Also, big horse chestnut and fir trees, and many other cultural properties exist. It is said that during the medieval ages, a town for lodging for lower ranking priests was formed around the shrine.

**l Literary monument**  
Literary monument  
From old times, the scenic area of Fuji Kawaguchi Town has been loved by writers and artists. For this reason many monuments are around the area. At Ubuyagasaki, there are Basho's monument with his haiku, "kumo kiri no zani hyakko o tsukushi keri (Clouds and mist. Mt. Fuji changes the scenery every moment. Panoramic scenery formed in an instant)" engraved on it, Senka Umocan's literary monument with a piece from his novel "Shonenko" engraved on it, a monument of Yamanashi prefecture's Japanese style painter Shunko Mochizuki's Fudezuka (Fudezuka is a burial site for worn out painting brushes) with the character "筆" (It is pronounced as fude. Fude means brush) in large lettering engraved on it, and a bronze relief of the photographer, Koyo Okada. Also, in 1938 (Showa era 13th year) Osamu Dazai stayed at Tenkaiya in the Misaka Toge Pass. Based on his own experience there, he wrote "Fugaku Hyakkei". Near Tenkaiya, there is a literary monument engraved with a piece from Dazai's work "Fugaku Hyakkei"; Evening primrose suits Fuji very well.

**m Ultra Trail Mount Fuji**  
Ultra Trail Mount Fuji is a trail running race that goes around the foot of Mt. Fuji that started in 2012. The total distance is about 170km; the difference in elevation is about 950m. Using the Fuji-Kawaguchi Town - Yagizaki Park as the start and goal point, the trail, abundant in nature, goes through mountain trails, footpaths, and woodland paths of both Yamanashi and Shizuoka prefectures. The time limit is 46 hours. From 2014, the Ultra Trail Mount Fuji has been selected for the World Tour; therefore, many top athletes not only from Japan, but also from Europe and the U.S.A. have been participating. With a distance of about 91 km, and a difference in elevation of about 4,700 m, a shortened version of the STY course (Fuji City, Shizuoka Prefecture - Fuji Kawaguchi Town) has also been set up.

**n Tatemaiwa Lava Rock**  
Tatemaiwa (Tatemaiwa Lava Rock) is on the tip of Funatsu Beach, which is a part of Lake Kawaguchi; this place is made from lava that flowed out of Mt. Fuji when it erupted. From here, the view of the lake is beautiful, and during the summer season when a draft blows through it feels very pleasant. There are tables and benches, and many families come here to have lunch. A long time ago, a stone statue of a monkey was in the lake close to the tip of Tatemaiwa Lava Rock; and a legend said that when a drought continued and the stone statue was raised there was a blessing of rain.
